Public Content

California's Proposition 30 passed in November 2012. This Act provides for the continuing funding for local schools and districts and community colleges into an Education Protection Account. Pursuant to a memorandum dated April 3, 2013, from the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office, districts have sole authority to determine how the amounts of money received in the Education Protection Account are spent, provided that the governing board makes these spending determinations in open session of a public meeting of the governing board. The disbursements and expenditures are subject to reporting requirements, annual independent financial and compliance auditing, and as required by law. The District estimates it will receive \$54,889,913.00 in revenues from the Education Protection Account in the fiscal year 2023-24.
